

Soawapak Hinjoy, DVM, MSc, MPH, DrPH, is a Thai public health physician and veterinarian with advanced degrees from Chulalongkorn University, Tulane University, and the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, where she earned her Doctor of Public Health in Epidemiology. She currently serves as Senior Advisor on Zoonoses and One Health at Thailand's Department of Disease Control and as President of the General Assembly of PREZODE, an international initiative dedicated to preventing zoonotic disease emergence. Over the course of her career, she has led national communicable disease surveillance, directed international health cooperation, and served as principal investigator on One Health research projects spanning avian influenza, leptospirosis, rabies, melioidosis, and emerging infectious diseases. She has authored and co-authored more than 30 peer-reviewed publications in leading journals including *PLOS Neglected Tropical Diseases*, *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, and *Frontiers in Veterinary Science*, contributing substantially to the evidence base for zoonotic disease control in Southeast Asia. Her work bridges veterinary science, epidemiology, and global health security, with a sustained focus on strengthening One Health systems at both national and regional levels.
