

Sun Bean Kim, MD, PhD, is a South Korean physician-scientist specializing in infectious diseases, with doctoral training from Yonsei University and board certifications in both internal medicine and infectious diseases. She currently serves as a Research Scientist in the Clinical, Assessment, Regulatory, and Evaluation (CARE) team at the International Vaccine Institute, where her work focuses on vaccine development, clinical trials, and emerging infectious diseases. Prior to joining IVI, she held faculty positions at Korea University College of Medicine for over seven years, building an extensive record in clinical research spanning HIV/AIDS, antimicrobial resistance, COVID-19 therapeutics, and immunocompromised infections. She has served as a principal author and contributor to more than 80 peer-reviewed publications and has led or participated in over 30 clinical trials involving vaccines and novel antimicrobial agents from sponsors including Pfizer, Gilead, and SK Bioscience. She also contributes to national health policy as an advisory committee member for multiple Korean government ministries and serves as Director of Research for the Korean Vaccine Society.
